102nd Meeting Minutes

1. Welcome and Introduction

Robbie thanked and welcomed members for coming to the meeting (16 members were present).

Martin and Bill approved the previous minutes from February. Apologies received – Penny, Andy M, Paul G, Mete and Daniel

2. Agenda Items

No significant comments made except that Martin, Bill and Robbie enjoyed the game at Bournemouth and Alan J mentioned how the Newcastle fans did not sit down, with many not wearing shirts etc. Andy P asked about how we obtained a considerable number of Bournemouth tickets only several days before the game. Richard confirmed that he had received an email from Kevin at 07:23 on the 21st and sent back all the names of all the members who had applied for a ticket. Richard continued to say that it sounded that Kevin had ~25 tickets and could not give them all to us but would give as many as possible. Richard then stated that by 08:33, a further email went out stating that all the Bournemouth tickets had been allocated to all branches.

Comments regarding forthcoming games in late March to early April

No significant comments made except that Martin commented that a rail strike was planned on the day of the Liverpool game.

Current membership – 38 with new members Alan Bennett and Phil M both present...... Both Alan and Phil M gave a brief account of themselves why they were Manchester City fans. Phil M stated that he had been watching Manchester City since the mid-1970s as he used to live halfway between Liverpool and Manchester with most of his friends supporting Manchester United or Liverpool. Phil M commented that his first game was with his Dad back in 1980 against Liverpool, with Manchester City losing 4-1. In the same season, Phil saw City's first win against Ipswich. Phil M was not aware of us at first and tried to join the A34 Winchester but was refused as he was outside their allocation zone. As Alan's father was a Manchester United fan, Alan never got to see Manchester City play as a child and did not go to Maine Road until being a late teenager. 4. Treasurer Update

Current Bank balance and recent transactions - £390.60 (as of 13th March). Initially the account did not have enough funds to cover the tickets for Bournemouth and the first transaction failed. To avoid this, Richard confirmed that he placed personally funds into the account to cover the Bournemouth ticket payment and then retrieved these funds at a later date, once members had paid for their tickets.

Andy P mentioned that getting into Leipzig was difficult as tickets were on our mobiles and some people had issues getting into the ground. Andy P mentioned that having mobile tickets could be advantageous or equally problematic as no system was perfect. Certain members, especially Dave mentioned the new proposals of the North Stand, with respect to the increased capacity, a new hotel, a new concert venue and transportation.
